

How can I help in partnership with the school?

Children learn a great deal from their parents and teachers. Home and school are the two most powerful influences on your child and they should be seen to be always working together.



- Attend meetings when requested
- •Ensure that your child has good attendance
- ·Help with homework and listen to your child read
- Help in a classroom to gain a better understanding of teaching and learning
- •Share an interest in your child's work and praise their efforts
- Read to your child regularly and visit libraries, bookshops and museums
- •Talk maths with your child all of the time, for example, recognising numerals and counting and sharing out objects

Preparing your child for school?

Your child will be in a class of approximately 30 small children. It will make starting school much easier and happier if they are independent and can do many things for themselves.

Can he/she...

- •Dress and undress themselves?
- •Use the toilet independently and ask to go there?
- •Tidy up after himself/herself?
- •Recognise their own name? Please tell your child's teacher if their name is abbreviated in any way.
- •Share toys and equipment?

ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO BE AS INDEPENDENT AS POSSIBLE EVEN IF IT TAKES FAR LONGER FOR THEM TO GET READY.

GET THEM USED TO A ROUTINE OF REASONABLY EARLY TO BED AND UP EARLY ENOUGH FOR YOU AND YOUR CHILD TO HAVE A STRESS FREE TIME TO GET READY FOR SCHOOL.

Attendance

Attendance is the biggest barrier to learning for any child and it is vitally important that all children attend school.

Children that attend school on a regular basis not only have the best chance in life, but have a better opportunity to achieve & succeed. Attendance is key to improving your child's physical, social & emotional well being.
